P. E. Million, the well known tobacco dealer of Foxport, and Miss Edna Orr Clark were married at Flemingsburg a few days ago.


Miss Lucretia Clay, State Regent of D. A. R., has called a conference of all the Chapters in the state to be held in Lexington Friday, October 6th.
