Town Marshal Killed.

INEZ, Ky., Oct. 3.—Joseph Kirk, town marshal, was murdered Sunday by Henry Cassaday in the mountains a few miles away. Cassaday fired two shots Saturday at Sampson Kirk, aged 50, without provocation. Kirk swore out a warrant for Cassaday, and the warrant was placed in Joseph Kirk's hands. Kirk rode to the residence of Cassaday, but he was not at home. On the way back Kirk met Cassaday. Kirk ordered him under arrest, and Cassaday raised his Winchester and shot three times. Death was instantaneous. A posse is now in pursuit. A lynching will occur.

Five Burglars in Jail.

FRANKFORT, Ky., Oct. 3.—Five professional burglars assaulted Willis Collins, a railroad hand, at Benson, this county, and after robbing him, beat him up severely. Town Marshal Secaree, of Bagdad, Constable David Harrod and a posse of citizens armed with shotguns, arrested the party at Christiansburg, and they were lodged in jail here Monday night. They gave the following names: J. H. Marton, Covington; Mike Milan, Montgomery, Ala.; Dave Foley, Lima, O.; and Henry Martin and Thomas Troy, Louisville.

Joseph D. Bondurant Dead.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 3.—News was received here Monday of the death, in New York, of Joseph D. Bondurant, formerly a widely known business man, and father of the four Bondurant girls, widely known as beauties—Mrs. Joseph Fallins, Mrs. Wm. English and Lily Bondurant Henry, of New York, and Mrs. Lewis O'Shaughnessy, of Cincinnati.

Mules for the Transval.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 3.—An agent for the English government is in Louisville and will close a contract Tuesday with Hudson Bros. for 3,000 mules at \$80 per head. The delivery will begin October 12 when the first carload will leave Louisville for New Orleans, where they will be shipped in cattle steamers for the Transval.

Goebel Gets the Rooster.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 3.—Secretary of State Finley will award the rooster to the Goebel ticket. This is a straight tip. Finley has as yet made no public declaration. A statute says where there is a split in a party the nominees of the convention called by the regular authorities shall be entitled to the party emblem.

A Fatal Fall.

HENDERSON, Ky., Oct. 3.—John Brady, a contractor of this city, fell from the third story of Rash's tobacco factory, on which he was at work Monday afternoon and sustained injuries from which he died soon afterwards. Deceased leaves a family. He was highly respected.

Dying in a Stable.

LEBANON, Ky., Oct. 3.—R. F. Abell, Jr., son of the late Alfred Abell, living with his mother, near town, was found in a stable nearby in a dying condition, caused by heart failure. He was removed to his mother's house, and died a few minutes later. He was unmarried.

Offutt Nominated.

LEBANON, Ky., Oct. 3.—Republicans Monday nominated Capt. A. Offutt, of this city, for the state senate. Prof. J. A. Timmons, who until 1895 had been a democrat, will be the republican nominee for representative from this district.

Dry Goods Man Falls.

LEBANON, Ky., Oct. 3.—W. G. Buckner, of the dry goods firm of W. G. Buckner & Co., assigned to T. C. Jackson for the benefit of his creditors. His liabilities are about \$9,000, with assets about \$7,000 to \$8,000.

Davies County Fair Opens.

OWENSON, Ky., Oct. 3.—The annual meeting of the Davies county fair, the largest agricultural and industrial and stock exhibit held in Kentucky, began Tuesday with crowded entries in all departments.

Good Price for a Yearling.

LOUISVILLE, Ky., Oct. 3.—Scott Newman Monday sold Bore Simmons, a yearling trotter, to Thomas Lawson, of Boston, for \$3,000. Mr. Newman recently sold Boralma, a 3-year-old, by the same sire for \$10,000.

Boralmas the Favorite.

LEXINGTON, Ky., Oct. 3.—In the \$10,000 futurity to be trotted Tuesday, Boralmas was favorite, selling in the pooling for \$225, Idolita \$200 and Extasy \$100.

Candidate Pratt Broken Down.

FRANKFORT, Ky., Oct. 3.—Clifton J. Pratt, republican nominee for attorney general, is broken physically. He has gone to his home at Madisonville.

Charged With Murder.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Oct. 3.—Charles Lehban, aged 13, touched a match to some paper which adorned Henry Cartwright's 13-year-old daughter. The girl was burned to death. Lehban is in jail charged with murder.

Dayton Woman Burned to Death.

DAYTON, O., Oct. 3.—Mrs. Pearl Warner, aged 23, is dead as a result of an attempt to start a fire with coal oil. She was literally burned from head to foot.
