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## RIVER NEWS.

The Lizzie Bay goes from Pomeroy tonight.

The Keystone State was up last night for Pittsburgh.

The Sunshine is due down from Pomeroy tonight.

The Virginia is advertised for Pittsburgh Saturday night.

There are seven Pilots "star gazing" between Louisville and Cincinnati whose homes are at Ghent.

Mrs. French and Mrs. Leathers of St. Louis are the only women on the Ohio and Mississippi rivers who hold Commanders' and Pilots' license.

The rate war between the rival packets in the Cincinnati and Louisville trade isn't setting the river on fire, and somebody is losing money and wearing out a steamboat.

Captain Edward Neff, who died Wednesday in Louisville, was one of the oldest steamboat engineers of the harbor. He was at the engines when the boat took old Dan Rice to New Orleans the first time he was ever there.

The big Snagboat Woodruff removed 116 snags, including one from right channel above Cabin creek and one from right channel in front of Eagle creek, 14 wrecks and 2 big rocks from the Ohio river on her down trip.

Commodore William Marnet says that after a number of vexatious delays, work has been resumed on the company's towing steamer Ark, at Pt. Pleasant, and the boat is expected to be completed inside of six weeks from this time.

At the meeting of the City Council in Memphis recently, application was made by the proprietors of the Lee Line packets for a permit to erect a building on the levee in close proximity to the wharf. The proposed building is to be an ornamental structure, which will add to the appearance of the river front and prove a source of comfort and convenience to patrons and passengers of boats. It will be provided with comfortable waiting-rooms and all modern conveniences, and will be in effect a river depot.
