KENTUCKY FLASHES.

REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

John W. Yerkes, of Danville, Nominated for Governor Without Any Opposition.

Louisville, Ky., July 18.—The republican state convention nominated for governor Hon. John W. Yerkes, of Danville, adopted a platform declaring the issue of the election to be the Goebel election law and adjourned within three hours.

There was no nomination to be made by this convention except for governor, as this year's election in Kentucky is an extraordinary one to fill the vacancy in the governorship made by the death of William Goebel.

Hon. John W. Yerkes, the nominee for governor, is a lawyer and one of the most prominent republicans in Kentucky. He is at present a collector of internal revenue, but before holding this place had not been an office-holder.

The platform which was unanimously adopted contained three planks, the second and third respectively endorsing the Philadelphia convention and its nominees and urging the government to protect Americans in China and the first one dealing with the state campaign.

The republican party of Kentucky is confronted with a special and extraordinary duty in the election of a governor. The events of the past 12 months draw together all the friends of social order and civil liberty.

Louisville, Ky., July 18.—Former Gov. W. O. Bradley declined a formal tender of the republican congressional nomination from the Eighth district.

Owensboro, Ky., July 18.—In a three handed duel at Hawesville, Hancock county, between Allen and Frank Pulliam, and Jack Hesson, Hesson was killed instantly and Allen Pulliam died three hours later.

Georgetown, Ky., July 18.—The proceedings in the Powers case were made more interesting by the introduction of several witnesses who gave more or less damaging testimony against the defendant.
