AT JACKSONVILLE.

The Ending of Martial Law Was Not Attended by Any Disorders.

TROOPS WILL GARRISON THE CITY.

A Shipbuilding Plant Which Was Burned Out Has Already Resumed Operations.

The Total Insurance Loss Will Perhaps Reach \$6,000,000, a Million More Than Estimated—Carloads of Supplies Arrive.

Jacksonville, Fla., May 17.—The ending of martial law Thursday was not accompanied by any disorder.

A shipbuilding concern which was burned has already resumed operations. The site of the burned Commercial bank building at Laura and Bay streets, 75 feet front on Bay, together with a small lot, with 32 feet front on Laura street, were sold Thursday for \$80,000.
