CONGRESSMAN KEHOE'S BILL.

Changes the Time For Holding Court in Eastern Judicial District.

Representative James N. Kehoe Tuesday introduced a bill in Congress changing the time and adding a new place for holding the United States Court in the Eastern District of this state.

The bill was referred to Representative Smith, a member of the House Judiciary Committee, and he will support it. A similar bill will, it is understood, be introduced by Senator Deboe, hence it is probable the bill will become a law during this session.

The amendment makes no change in the places of holding Court except to add Catlettsburg.

This is expected to bring on the old controversy between Catlettsburg and Ashland, but the former city seems to have the backing of the delegation.

The time of holding Court is as follows:

Covington—Beginning first Monday in March and fourth Monday in September, in lieu of first Monday in April and third Monday in October.

Frankfort—First Monday in April and third Monday in October, in lieu of second Monday in March and fourth Monday in September.

Richmond—Third Monday in April and first Monday in November, in lieu of fourth Monday in April and second Monday in November.

London—First Monday in May and third Monday in November, in lieu of second Monday in May and fourth Monday in November.

Catlettsburg—Third Monday in May and second Monday in December.

OF TELEPHONE TURNPIKE FRANCHISE AND PRIVILEGE.....

By order of the Fiscal Court of Mason county, I will, on

Saturday, Dec. 21, 1901,

At 11 o'clock a. m., at the Courthouse door in Maysville, Ky., offer for sale a public utility to the highest and best bidder—but reserving in the Fiscal Court the right to reject any and all bids for the franchise and privilege—but not the exclusive franchise or privilege—for a period of twenty years, to construct, operate and maintain a telephone system on, over and along the following public roads in Mason county, viz:

1.—The Maysville and Lexington Turnpike Road and its Branch Roads, viz: Jersey Ridge Turnpike, Kenton Station Turnpike, Maple Turnpike, Clark's Run Turnpike, Mayfield and Millcreek Turnpike, Mayfield and Sardis Turnpike, Abolion Creek Turnpike, and Mayfield and Flat Rock Turnpike.

2.—The Mt. Sterling Turnpike Road and its Branch Roads, viz: Taylor's Mill Turnpike, Strode's Run Turnpike, Horsehoe Turnpike, Owens's Turnpike, Lewisburg and Mt. Gilead Turnpike, and Millcreek Turnpike.

3.—The Hill City Turnpike Road and its Branch Road, the Horsehoe Turnpike.

Each of the three main roads, including their branches, will be offered for sale separately, on a credit of six months. Purchaser will be required to execute bond, bearing interest, with good surety. In the event the sale is approved and confirmed by the Fiscal Court, the purchaser shall in good faith commence the construction of said telephone system within six months from date of confirmation of sale and complete same as soon as practicable, and as soon as patronage will justify, and shall furnish good and efficient service at reasonable charges, and give all county officials the free use of the system for official business.
