ITEMS OF INTEREST FROM MANY STATES

Brief Mention of a Day's Important Happenings in This Big World of Ours.

About two hundred and fifty employees of the People's Gaslight and Coke Company at Chicago went on a strike.

Emerson Reynolds, father of Wesley Reynolds, killed by bank robbers at Westville, Ind., has become violently insane through brooding over the fate of his boy.

In a Sunday-school in Brooklyn a little girl who had accidentally swallowed a toy, died while surrounded by a praying minister and her fellow Sunday-school scholars.

The Western Union Telegraph Company has in the United States 972,769 miles of wire stretched for telegraphic communication; the Postal Telegraph Company has 170,000 miles.

The nude corpse of Hannah Goddard Knapp, the third wife of Alfred Knapp, the self-confessed multi-murderer of Hamilton, O., was found floating in the Ohio river near New Albany Monday.

King Leopold of Belgium has subscribed \$2,500 to the Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine for inquiries to be made in Congo Free State respecting measures to combat the deadly malaria.

A French artist, Boehard, has discovered a method by which he can reproduce any subject by photography on painter's canvas, reducing to the minimum the difficult art of painting reproductions.

The Rev. Dr. Charles L. Spiving of Orange, N. J., once an Indian known among the race as Chief Blackbeard, is now a preacher in the First Presbyterian Church and is deeply interested in everything concerning the welfare of the red men.

Two trainmen were killed and a third was fatally wounded when a Baltimore and Ohio fast freight was ditched by train wreckers near Lebanon, Ill. The wreckers, it is alleged, threw a switch with the intention of wrecking an express train, which usually carries money.

Chairman Fowler of the House Committee on Banking and Currency introduced a currency bill which he hopes to have passed instead of the Payne-Aldrich bill now pending in both Houses. The new measure provides, among other things, that National Banks must pay 2 per cent. interest on Government deposits.

The oldest of the very few remaining original Daughters of the Revolution is Mrs. Mary F. Cobb of Ruesville, Ind. Mrs. Cobb, who recently celebrated her one hundred and first birthday anniversary, is the daughter of a private in the Revolutionary War and the granddaughter of a Captain under Washington. She remembers well having heard Henry Clay and Daniel Webster speak. Mrs. Cobb is a relative of William Jennings Bryan.

Dr. Sven Hedin has been made honorary member of the Scottish Geographical Society, an honor rarely given. It has also awarded him the Livingston memorial gold medal, the distinguished services which he rendered to science by his explorations in Central Asia. That medal, which was founded to commemorate the life work of David Livingstone, is the highest distinction which Scotchmen can confer on distinguished explorers.

The Federal Salt Company of San Francisco has been indicted on charges of violating the anti-trust laws.

Jerome Anderson of Seymour, Ind., has been found guilty of trying to kill his wife and mother-in-law with poison.

A general strike of the members of the Building Trades Council at Muncie, Ind., has been ordered, and hundreds of men failed to report for work.

Three trainmen were killed in a wreck in the New York Central yards at Syracuse, N. Y. The men were asleep in a caboose which was derailed and ran across the main track, where an express train struck it.

The "Patriot War" began in Canada in 1837. It was caused by the refusal of England to grant such governmental reforms as were demanded by the Canadian people. A number of the insurgents fled from Toronto to the United States. One of these, Mackenzie, with some 25 followers, recruited in Buffalo, attacked and captured Canadian Navy island in the Niagara river above the falls. On December 2, 1837, these insurgents captured the Canadian steamer Caroline, and cut it adrift and allowed it to plunge over the falls. President Van Buren issued a proclamation of neutrality and Gen. Wool was dispatched to the Niagara frontier to see that the proclamation was enforced. The so-called war ended by the capture of the insurgents on Navy island on January 13, 1838, and the sacrifice of life and property was without any tangible result.

Ensign Ward K. Wortman of the battleship Massachusetts will be tried by court-martial as a result of the recent explosion which killed nine of the crew. Wortman is charged in five counts with "culpable inefficiency."

Overman of North Carolina; Reed Smoot of Utah; William J. Stone of Missouri; and A. C. Latimer of South Carolina.

Those whose terms expire on March 4 are: Senators Turner of Washington; Jones of Arkansas; Simon of Oregon; Wellington of Maryland; Heitfeld of Idaho; Mason of Illinois; McLaurin of South Carolina; Harris of Kansas; Deboe of Kentucky; Jones of Nevada; Pritchard of North Carolina; Rawlins of Utah; and Vest of Missouri.

Sixteen Senators whose terms expire on March 4 succeed themselves.

River News

The Sprague will go South this week with her first tow.

The Henry M. Stanley will be down tonight from Pomroy.

The Keystone State will be down tonight from Pittsburgh.

The towboat Excel sank Saturday morning below Creaton. No lives were lost.

The City of Louisville ran from New Orleans to Memphis in three days and seven hours, losing fifteen hours in fog; from Greenville to Memphis in 23 hours, and from Helena to Memphis in 6 hours and 23 minutes.

It is a general belief among rivermen that when a steamboat is burned two others are to meet with a similar fate—always "three of a kind." The City of Clifton, L. H. Buhman and Valley Queen burned one after another recently.

Captain R. W. Wise has been appointed by the Board of Directors of the Cincinnati Chamber of Commerce as Chairman of the Committee on River Freights to serve one year, beginning March 1st. His associates are E. R. Mauck, Fred Hartweg and Oscar Barrett.

Suit has been entered by William K. Starteher against the Monongahela River Consolidated Coal and Coke Company for \$10,000 for the death of plaintiff's son, Mr. William E. Starteher, who worked for the Company. It is claimed that he was ordered to take a line out to a coalboat, and the skiff that he was in was crushed between the fleet and he was drowned.

Contrary to expectations at Pittsburgh the rivers are not falling nearly so rapidly as they rose for the present flood, the rate of decline Monday evening at 9 o'clock being only .2 of a foot an hour. As the waters have receded from downtown and lower Allegheny districts, mud has been left. Many cellars are still full of water, and it is feared a great amount of sickness may result.


