The Grand Jury of Mason County yesterday refused to indict John Bruist, 20, who shot and killed his father, Louis Bruist, at Minerva two weeks ago today. The dead man was drunk and was abusing the boy's mother.

Chester Savage, the boy murderer of his uncle, Mr. William Savage, has been in Jail here for two years and his trial is now in progress in Mason Circuit Court.
Mrs. Bessie Smoot, who shot and killed her husband, Ed Smoot, at Flemingsburg Monday is now a prisoner in the Mason county Jail.

Pedestrians passing along Third street in the neighborhood of the First Presbyterian Church witnessed an awe-spiring sight.
