Steel manufacturers expect about 50% tariff reduction.

Secretary Wright has approved the revised plans for a new bridge across the Mississippi river at St. Louis, the structure to be built by the city.

Five Negroes were mortally wounded at Fidelia, in Christian county, in a general fight.

Herman Wade, 16 years old, and Lyle Misener, 14, were drowned in Stone Lake, near Cassopolis, Mich., by breaking through the ice while skating.

The passing of sentence on Abraham Ruef, convicted of bribing former Supervisor Furry, was again continued by Judge Lawler at San Francisco until next Tuesday.

At Grayson, Grant Stamper was instantly killed and C. Stamper, his nephew, was mortally wounded as the result of a quarrel between Frank Prater, Marshal of Grayson, and his brother, Fred Prater.

Adams, after deliberating on the case for over five hours, it was the general belief that the twelve men were hopelessly hung and that it would result in a mis-trial. For the first time in many years Court was held on Christmas Day.
