The five indictments against Al Wallace for gambling, &c., were, on motion of the Attorney for the Commonwealth, ordered set aside and that the defendant be released from custody upon his own recognizance, in the sum of \$100 each in the above five indictments, to be void, however, if he appears in the Mason Circuit Court on the seventh day of its present term.

In the case of Robert Warner, for breaking into Joseph H. Dodson's store and commission house, the Jury disagreed.

Frank Hanson was fined \$100 and Court costs.
