SOME FORMER FREEZE-UPS
 Colonel R. R. Maltby of Washington dropped in to The Ledger office this morning "just to remind you" that there were other cold snaps behind you.
 He declared that the present vegetable and fruit tragedy is nothing compared with the weather of June 3d, 1859, when gardens, crops and fruits were literally ruined by the freeze-up. He says the corn crop was bitten off close to the ground, but still there was a fair crop. On April 17th, 1876, Colonel Maltby said, the mercury was down to 12° and that the ice on the ponds was 2 1/2 inches thick, strong enough for the boys to skate upon and almost thick enough to harvest. Every living bit of vegetation was blasted and there was no fruit at all that year. So let's cheer up.
