COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The City Fathers met in adjourned session last night, Mayor Lee presiding and all members present with exception of Councilman A. Clooney.

The following belated accounts were allowed: Joseph Harrison, clock keeper, \$18.75; C. and O. Railway Company \$133.60.

The list of members of the Washington and Limestone Fire Companies were read and accepted.

A statement was read from City Treasurer James W. Fitzgerald acknowledging the receipt of \$51,598, the same having been paid over by City Clerk W. J. Kerwin as amount of tax collections for 1910.

John Burk was granted the privilege of removing his saloon from No. 8 East Second street to No. 6 same street.

Brawley Bros., sidewalk contractors, having assigned to the Farmers' and Traders' Bank all moneys due them by the City of Maysville for sidewalk construction, was, upon their own petition, ordered paid to said Bank.

The same order was made regarding moneys due Hord & Evans.

An ordinance requiring property owners to have weeds growing on their premises cut at their own expense, under a penalty of \$10 fine in failing so to do, was read, and upon suspension of the rules, was passed and adopted.

Member Harover stated that inasmuch as the last meeting was held on a legal holiday, and in order to estop any quibble that might arise as to the legality of actions taken at said meeting, he thought it wise that a resolution ratifying the work of Monday night should be adopted, which was promptly done, all voting aye.

The Mayor was authorized to confer with the Streetcar Company in regard to the rearrangement of the car track in Market street.

In regard to the wall on the Wallace property in Fifth street, the Committee reported that it was a matter in which the city was in no wise concerned.

The Mayor was instructed to proceed with the condemnation as a nuisance the old sheds on the Collins lot in East Second street, Fifth Ward.

The Internal Improvement Committee was authorized to repair West Second street beginning where the contemplated brick street ends.

The following sidewalk apportionments—with the exception of noted defects—were read and approved: Limestone street, from Second to Fourth; Wood street, from Second to Forest avenue; William street, from Forest to Market; Grave alley, Third street, from Plum to Market street.

The Mayor and City Attorney were authorized to have said apportionments published.

The fate of the tree in front of the residence of W. H. Means in West Second street is to remain unmolested until the present injunction suit on hands is decided.

Council adjourned to give Fire Chief Edward Brite an opportunity to explain the workings and merits of a fire alarm and r'olice box, one of which had been fitted up in the Council Chamber for the special edification and instruction of the members.

Republican Convention For the Ninth Congressional District of Kentucky

To the Republicans of the Ninth District of Kentucky:

You are respectfully requested to meet in Mass Conventions at the Courthouses in your respective counties (Boyd excepted—to be held at City Hall, Ashland) on Saturday, July 16th, 1910, at 1:30 p. m., (standard time) to select delegates to attend a convention to be held at Maysville, Ky., Wednesday, July 20th, 1910, at 10 a. m., (standard time) for the purpose of nominating a Republican candidate for Congress for the Ninth Congressional District of Kentucky to be voted for at the regular November election, 1910.

The basis of representation in said District Convention shall be one vote for each 100 votes or fraction over 50 votes cast for the Honorable William H. Taft for President in November, 1908, and the votes of the various counties shall be as follows—

Internal Revenue Collector Sam J. Roberts reports that the collections in the Seventh Kentucky District—of which Maysville is a part—for the fiscal year ending June 30th were \$3,971,136.68, the largest collection for the District during any one fiscal year since its establishment.

By scientific tillage, Nebraska Experiment Station has averaged over 60 bushels of wheat to the acre, for the past four years. And another field in Alberta, by the same method, averaged 70 bushels of wheat per acre, another 46 bushels per acre, and made \$14,000 clear profit in one year. The other crop yields are equally as good and without irrigation. This irrigated land has sold as high as \$3,000 per acre.
