#### WOMAN IN BLACK MAKES INQUIRIES

#### Mysterious Circumstances Still Surround Identity of Man Killed at Maysville

Mysterious circumstances again surround the case of the unidentified victim of the railroad at Maysville, Ky., who was buried under the impression he was Paul ("Troy") Maurer of Newport. This time it's a mysterious woman in black that is giving the local authorities much concern.

Yesterday a woman in black and heavily veiled called at Ershell's undertaking establishment at Newport. She asked the undertaker to make a minute description of the man now buried in the Maurer family plot. When this was given she said that the description tallied precisely with that of a missing brother with one exception—that the two fingers of her brother were taken off at the first joint and not at the knuckle. The woman then left the place, but refused to give her name.

Frank Maurer, 723 Isabella street, when he heard of the accident, went to Maysville and identified the man found as that of his nephew, Paul ("Troy") Maurer. He then had the body removed and buried from his home at Newport. Shortly after the funeral it was learned that Maurer was alive and well in Chicago.

The man buried apparently was unknown.

In the meantime the body of the buried man, which bore a remarkable resemblance to Maurer, lies in the Maurer lot at Evergreen Cemetery. As the family has already been put to the expense of one burial they do not think it is their place to remove the body. The local authorities refuse to act and the body will remain interred until the arrival of the real Paul ("Troy") Maurer from the Windy City.
