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**MURDER IN LEXINGTON**

That was a terrific indictment of  
Lexington Judge Charles Kerr gave  
the Blue Grass capital when he said  
it and Fayette county furnished more  
homicides in the past year than  
London, England, with all her team-  
ing millions. We haven't the figures  
handy but we know something of  
Judge Kerr and he would make no  
such statement without the facts to  
back him.

Lexington has been blessed with  
several killings the past year in the  
Red Light district, but, so far as a  
close reading would permit, we have  
failed to note that a single murderer  
was sent to the electric chair by a  
Fayette jury. In only one instance  
we remember was a life sentence im-  
posed. One slayer got off absolute-  
ly scot free and another was sent  
to lunatic asylum from which he es-  
caped only Wednesday night. The  
victims of these crimes rest in un-  
mourned and unhonored graves while  
their slayers breathe the air they  
contaminate and actually mingle  
with men who claim to be respectable  
in the cafes of Lexington.

We hear much of killings in  
Breathitt county. Nearly every  
newspaper in the United States will  
publish the story of a killing in  
Breathitt, but if such a thing hap-  
pens in Lexington it is either not  
told at all in the outside press or is  
buried inside the papers publishing  
it without any unduly prominent  
headlines. Breathitt has suffered as  
a result and we doubt if even  
Breathitt county can equal the rec-  
ord of Fayette last year in the reck-  
less disregard of human life shown  
by its gun-users.

If some of those who make it a  
practice to loaf around questionable  
resorts could be sent to the electric  
chair, regardless of their pull with  
the police and with the community it  
would help mightily to clear the air  
down in that populous and wealthy  
county. The trouble in Fayette  
county is partly with the police in  
Lexington in their failure to clear  
out the restricted district of such  
vagabonds and with the alleged re-  
spectable men of the city who as-  
sociate with the cattle that infest  
these joints and then attempt to  
mingle with men who have some  
trace of self-respect. The jurie-  
themselves are also to blame for  
their apparent willingness to strain  
a point in giving the defendant in  
murder trials the benefit of the doubt.  
It seems they get all the benefit  
judging from the result of the trial  
in the Fayette courts.

Few people in Central Kentucky  
have forgotten one famous Fayette  
case, when a young saloon loafer  
shot down without provocation one  
of the leading citizens of Lexington  
gave a straw bond and was practi-  
cally allowed to walk of the Police  
Judge and the police officials, and  
has never been apprehended to this  
day. A man who slew a council-  
man in his own hotel has been twice  
tried with hung juries both times. It  
seems that it is impossible to ob-  
tain the conviction of gun-users in  
that county. So long as that con-  
dition obtains Lexington is likely to  
continue to lead London in murders
