The Gentry and Smith boys were engaged in a fight when Smith appeared as peacemaker with the above result. A posse is after Gentry.

## Expired at the Breakfast Table.

Covington, Ky., June 10.—Phillip Ruchford, 60, expired suddenly while seated at the breakfast table at 1901 Madison street. His death recalls a shooting affray. John Buckley, a constable, had, it was alleged, wronged one of his daughters and Ruchford rounded him so severely that he was not expected to live.

## Lived as Strangers in Their Home.

Covington, Ky., June 10.—The domestic troubles of Dr. and Mrs. B. F. Eckman, prominent residents, reached the divorce court Thursday. It developed that although they have continued to live in the same house at 1901 Madison avenue, they have been as strangers to each other.

## Judge Bullock Weds.

Lexington, Ky., June 10.—County Judge Frank A. Bullock of this county, and Miss Grace Hambrick, formerly of Wood county, were married in Louisville Thursday night. Judge Bullock is frequently termed the Richard Croker of the Fayette county democracy.

Called to Lancaster. Lancaster, Ky., June 10.—Rev. J. R. Ellis, of Louisville, was called to the Baptist church of this place and preached his initial sermon Sunday. He has moved his family here and will give the pulpit for his congregation two Sundays of each month.

Estill Springs Sold. Louisville, Ky., June 10.—A syndicate headed by W. H. Smith, of Lansing, Mich., has purchased the famous Estill Springs, in Estill county, paying Capt. J. M. Thomas \$40,000 for the property. W. H. Thomas will remain as manager of the hotel.

Despondent Over Love Affairs. Frankfort, Ky., June 10.—H. C. Wilson, a schoolteacher and insurance man, aged 35, committed suicide near Bridgeport by shooting himself on the farm of his father, John S. Wilson. He had been despondent over a love affair, it is said.

The Ordinance Voted. Lexington, Ky., June 10.—Mayor Combs Thursday night vetoed the ordinance passed by the council Thursday night which in effect boycotted non-union labor. In vetoing the ordinance the mayor said it was unconstitutional.

Crescote Blocks. Covington, Ky., June 10.—Scott street, from Twelfth street to Eighteenth street, will be improved with crescote blocks, the aldermen at their meeting concurring in the action of the council by a unanimous vote.

Calhoun's Fight. June 10.—Hilly contested elections as to whether or not whisky should be sold in Runsey and Calhoun were held Wednesday. The try was won by the whisky in Runsey and by a vote of 37 to 25 in Calhoun.
