LAST FRIDAY in the Lower House of our national law-making body four hundred and eight private pension bills were passed. After passing these bills some time was devoted to considering a bill providing for a uniform naturalization. Our Congressmen could confer no greater and lasting benefit upon this country than to put our naturalization laws upon a higher plane. At present they are entirely too lax. We need greater restrictions and more exacting laws if we expect our country to prosper and reach a higher, grander and nobler state of civilization. There is no reason why we should be content with the dumping ground of Europe or any other foreign country. Let us welcome to our shores the worthy, but keep a sharp lookout against those who are not already well qualified for citizenship.

LAST Wednesday Hon. R. W. Miller, representative of Madison county, made a speech in the House of Representatives of half an hour's duration, the length of which has not been heard in the legislative halls for years. Mr. Miller had introduced in the House a bill requiring an annual accounting from all the companies doing business within the State. The insurance lobby, which has fought all insurance legislation for years, made the statement that Mr. Miller continued his fight for his bill, he need never try to occupy a seat in public life again. Undaunted by their threats, with an indomitable will and determination characteristic of the man he waged war. When he began speaking the crowds in the lobby pressed into the House, and a number of Senators came from their chamber to hear the speaker eloquently. After arguing the great necessity for such a law, he had proposed, he begged pardon and made a short personal allusion. Concluding his speech, the members crowded around him, shook his hand and showered congratulations upon him. When the vote was taken not a single member voted against the bill. This is the second bill Mr. Miller has put through the House with a unanimous vote after members had told him they were going to vote against them. His Normal School bill which passed the House two weeks ago with a dissenting vote, is of great importance, as it will increase our educational facilities an hundred fold. When he made his fight against the insurance octopus and won such signal victory, it was one of the greatest victories won for the people in years. And how about Miller's Honor man who cast his vote for him, feeling justly proud of such a representative, and those who voted against him, possibly regret it now, but feel equally proud of the man and his great work. May he never expect to occupy a position in public life again? No! For Miller now lives in the hearts and confidence of the people whom he has so ably and nobly served, and they will surely take care of him when the test is applied.
