### Farm and Stock

In several counties in Texas last week new wheat was being bought from the thrasher at \$1.35 per bushel. This means that flour will make another big jump in the near future.

The Falmouth Pendleton says: "The pooled wool crop in Pendleton county, delivered at Falmouth last week and stored in the Equity Storage Warehouse in Falmouth, will be shipped this week. The wool delivered aggregated 10,587 and brought the neat sum of about \$3,000."

Philadelphia Press: "If there is the same increase this year in the values of farm products as there has been every year for a decade there will exceed \$8,000,000,000. That is over four times the value of all the products of American farms in the Philadelphia Centennial year. Output of the farms is doubling every fifteen years."

Reports from the Green River district of Kentucky state that agents of the Green River Tobacco Association are now going through the county securing pledges for the pooling of the 1909 crop. Considerable success in getting the farmers to sign up is reported, and it is claimed that the pledges this year will be more numerous than last. The home Warehouse organization at Owensboro is also circulating pledges and report numerous signers.

Leonard B. Clore, the Indiana "corn king" who won the grand sweepstakes at the Chicago corn show and captured it again at Omaha last winter, carrying home special prizes valued at \$4,000, will be barred out of the National Corn Show next December, because his white dent corn has reached so near perfection that growers in other States think it not worth while to compete. Mr. Clore is considering a proposition to go to Russia to teach Russian farmers how to grow corn.

A bulletin from the New York Experiment Station shows how important lime and moulting are for alfalfa. In 163 tests where moulting soil from the Station field was sent to farmers for use on their own fields, 66 crops were successful, while only 25 adjoining unmoulting plots gave good crops. In 64 tests where lime was used, all but 6 plots showed improvement and 27 plots were changed from failure to success by liming. Where both moulting and lime were used, 77 per cent of the crops were successful; while less than 25 per cent of the untreated plots succeeded.

### A Growing Order.

According to the last report just completed, the K. of P. Order in Kentucky is in a most flourishing condition and growing rapidly. The new Lodges were instituted during the year, making now 172 in all, with a membership of 13,325. This membership comprises one Past Supreme Chancellor, 18 Past Grand Chancellors, 2,327 Past Chancellors, 10,854 Knights, 55 Esquires and 70 Pages. During last year the sum of \$36,424.13 was expended by the Order in Kentucky for the relief of sick members and for funeral benefits. The assets of the various subordinate lodges include cash, \$31,631.60; real estate, \$50,411.07; paraphernalia and furniture \$45,730.71.
