Makes Real Live Report.

Shows Where County is Deficient in Many Places.

But Praises Good Work of the Official in Their Efforts to Build Up.

Grows Patriotic in Closing Report.

We the Grand Jury of Madison County, at this February term of 1911, after thoroughly investigating the present conditions of the county, from every standpoint within our reach, beg to file the following as our report.

### TURKPIKES.

We have investigated at length the conditions of the turnpikes in the county, and find with one or two exceptions they are reported to be in as bad condition as turnpikes could well be, and while we feel that some definite action should be taken against the offending parties, yet with the present business like organizations of our road Commissioner and the excellent work accomplished during the past year, we feel that our county is in better condition than it has been, and that the money that is being expended now for the betterment of our county roads, is reaching the end to be attained in a way to be heartily commended, and we endorse the action of our Road Commissioner, and the Fiscal Court, in the purchase of road machinery that will better equip the county to care independently for its own highways.

We further recommend that the Fiscal Court, of the county acquire by purchase or other available means, such stone quarries as may be needed along each section of the turnpikes for the use of the stone crushers.

It has further come to our notice that on one or two occasions the citizens along the turnpikes have come to the relief of the county officials with generous contributions to assist in reconstruction of the roads, but we feel that the county funds when judiciously and properly distributed are amply adequate to build and maintain our roads, and thus relieve the citizens of this special burden. to aid the county officials in the acquisitions of stone quarries and labor at a reasonable price to construct and maintain our public highways.

### IMPROVEMENT WITHOUT SALOONS.

We have at great length tried to exhaust every means available to us to

investigate every avenue that leads to the illicit sale of whiskey, and have found its lair in a few cases, and are satisfied that others exist yet. We find that less whiskey is consumed now than at any preceding time in the history of our county, and that we point to the memorable crowd that attended the city of

Richmond on its February Court Day, of 1911, when there was not a single arrest for drunkenness and we believe that, with all that might be said to the contrary, the morals and business of our county is in a better condition, and society is more ably protected, under the no-license system than it was when whiskey was sold in the county.

### OFFICERS AND JAIL CONDITIONS.

We further find that our county officials have been diligent in the discharge of their duties and are keeping their respective offices and records in splendid condition; we find however that our county jail is sadly lacking in many points, and we recommend to the proper authorities the following changes: first that the wood floors used as public corridors should for sanitary reasons, be removed, and replaced by concrete or metal floors; second that the painting on the inside of the jail and cells is not of a kind and color that is best suited to the end to be attained, and we recommend that the cell work of the jail be repainted in a color that would at least suggest cheerfulness; third we are fully persuaded that a generous application of soap and water occurs daily to the bedding, and prisoners, environment would greatly improve the sanitary conditions and we so recommend.

### PATRIOTIC OUTBURST.
