Tobacco Stripping.

Silas Shelburn, the Lexington tobacco expert, gives the following valuable suggestion on tobacco stripping:

"It would pay to take more pains in the handling and grading. They should be sure that the stems are well dried before they begin stripping, as the buyers will not pay much for tobacco with swollen stems. It should be tied in medium-sized bundles. We are expecting fair prices for the bright crops, and for all the bright grades, while all the heavy dark crops and red grades will sell low, so one can readily see the importance of separating the colors. They should put bright with bright, red with red, green with green and dark with dark. A great many of them seem to pull off so many leaves at the bottom of the plant. The rough, dark stuff should be thrown out of the flues, so as to make them as bright as possible, and all the red leaves should be thrown out of the trash and lug grades to give them more color and less body. This bright leaf might be classed with bright lugs, but the heavy red leaves should be put with red grades, leaving bright leaf with more color and with some body suitable for wrappers. The different curings in this crop will be very different in color and quality and should not be mixed in the grading."

Stock Inspectors Warned.

Dr. A. J. Payne, State Live Stock Inspector, is notifying all County Live Stock Inspectors that they must certify to movements of sheep going into other States intended for purposes other than immediate slaughter. All sheep not intended for such purposes to be shipped into other States must be billed through Louisville or Covington and there dipped under the supervision of a Federal Inspector, who will certify to the interstate movement of such sheep.

A violation of these rules by County Live Stock Inspectors is punishable by a fine of from \$100 to \$500 and the rule must be strictly enforced by all County Live Stock Inspectors.
