

**Parcels Post.**

The *Irrepressible Gazette* contains the following article on the *Parcels Post*, which will be interesting to those who have had dealings with the various express companies and are familiar with the exorbitant charges the public is forced to pay on account of lack of competition. The *Parcels Post* is sure to come.

"The Postal Progress League, with offices at New York and Boston, has been organized to push the campaign for a parcels post. Its bill has been introduced into the House by William Sulzer of New York. It provides for a general parcels service at 1 cent each two ounces, 8 cents a pound (the old parcels rate of 1874), and for a local service on the rural routes on parcels up to a pound, 1 cent; on large parcels up to 11 pounds, 5 cents; on parcels over 11 pounds up to 25 pounds, 10 cents; with the insurance of all mail matter. This bill is pronounced "the entering wedge for a lower rate and a greater carrying capacity." It is universally conceded that farmers would profit greatly by a parcels post service. They will get it if they ask for it. Personal letters to senators and congressmen carry most force.

These lectures are of an educational nature, with the idea of giving the public generally a comprehensive knowledge of the automobile and gasoline engine, but there will be no admission charge and everything will be free.
