Nitrate of Soda on Old Meadows.

On an old meadow which has not been properly fertilized a top dressing of nitrate of soda is almost certain to show marked results. The farmer is likely to be so enthusiastic over the showing made that he at once concludes that nitrogen is the one factor needed to make his hay crop a profitable one. Right here lies the danger. While the first application of nitrate of soda may show these marked results, it is not by any means safe to conclude that nitrogen is the only element of fertility needed. Repeated applications of nitrate of soda may result in no apparent benefit and even result in a final condition worse than the original condition. The first application of nitrate of soda shows such marked results because there is a marked deficiency of nitrogen in the soil; but there is sufficient of the other fertilizing elements, particularly phosphorus and potassium to balance the nitrogen used. The increased crop yields from the use of nitrate of soda make an increased drain upon the available phosphorus and potassium of the soil. No efforts being made to replace these elements thus removed, the time very soon comes when no response is received from the application of nitrate of soda, because the

phosphoric acid and potash have been depleted, or, in other words, are the limiting factors. As a rule, when nitrate of soda is used as a fertilizer it is a safe principal to use in connection with its some form of phosphorus and potassium, having in mind permanent results rather than a temporary increase due to nitrate of soda.



Foreigners May Not Send Money to Europe.

The U. S. Postoffice Department has issued an order notifying postmasters not to accept money orders for transmission to the war zone in Europe for more than \$100, and no money will be sent by the foreigners in the United States to those of their kin in the war zone.

To aid the return home of Americans now in Europe, postmasters at international offices, until otherwise instructed, may issue money orders in their favor, upon application, limiting the amount to \$100 for each person.

These instructions apply to European countries only. The Department received a cablegram from the Postal Administration of Egypt announcing cessation of issues by that country and the Sudan of money orders on the United States. Postmasters at international offices are to make note to that effect, and, until otherwise instructed, will decline to issue orders on offices in Egypt or Sudan.

TOBACCO.

The tobacco outlook in Nicholas county, Ky., is much brighter than at any time since the crop was set out. While there is a shortage of at least 25 per cent in the acreage of the county, it is believed there will be a good yield, considering the season. In many sections of the county farmers are through cutting and housing their crop, while in other sections the crop was planted late and the tobacco is small. The farmers are inclined to believe that this crop will be heavy in weight, of good quality, but that color will be lacking.

The tobacco crop which has largely gone into the barns, is said to be one of the best ever grown in Owen county.

Tobacco in McCracken county is much better than was expected, and some sections report the best yield in five years.

A. H. Turner, of Anderson county, exhibited some leaves of tobacco in Lawrenceburg last week, which measured 39 inches long and 24 inches in width.

The early crop which has been cut in Fayette county, is above the average. The late tobacco is very promising, and unless caught by the frost will be almost as good as the early crop.

The Tenth Street Tobacco Warehouse, of Louisville, has sold 255 hds. of re-dried Burley Tobacco at prices ranging from \$5.50 to \$18.50. One good crop shipped from Owen county, made an average of \$15.50.

Forest A. Griffin, a tobacco broker of Aurora, Ind., has bought the first crop of new tobacco in Southeastern Indiana, as it stood in the field, for 10 cents a pound. It is estimated that there will be thirty thousand lbs. in the lot.

In Montgomery county some of the tobacco which growers thought would not make a half crop will make at least two-thirds of a crop. The tobacco is of excellent size, large leaf, and indicates heavy weight in all fields.

The tobacco crop in Henderson, Webster and Union counties is the finest that has been grown in many years. The late rains have been of untold value to tobacco as most growers were unusually late in setting out the weed.

The tobacco crop in Garrard this season will probably prove a banner crop, judging from present indications, although the acreage is somewhat shorter than usual. The crop, according to the estimate of those in a position to know, will very likely reach 7,000,000 pounds. This is due evidently to the unusual weight of the weed.

Farmers of Madison county have been busily engaged for the past three weeks cutting and housing a very fine crop of Burley tobacco. The yield per acre will be very large in pounds. Recent rains have made this one of the best crops for several years.

The farmers of Bracken county have been cutting their tobacco and a great many say they have the biggest and finest tobacco they ever had, and a few claim the best they ever grew.

Farmers of Woodford county are very busy every suitable day cutting and housing their tobacco crop. The work has been delayed somewhat on account of occasional rains. Throughout the county, on every side, some of the very finest crops of tobacco ever seen have been raised, and should bring splendid prices if nothing injures it in curing.

Beyond all doubt, the present tobacco crop is the greatest, as far as fineness goes, ever raised in Barren county. While not the largest, it is certainly the finest, and will probably bring more money than any crop ever produced in the county. Acre after acre, and field after field, are as high as a man's head, rich and heavy, and will bring two thousand pounds to the acre. Barren county people say they have never seen anything like it.

The showers interfered with tobacco cutting last week in Clark county. Many crops will be rushed into barns in the next few days. The early tobacco is above the average and late tobacco will also be fine if frost holds off for a while. Every buyer in the field is afraid to hazard an opinion as to what will be paid for Burley this time. Mr. Prewitt Burch succeeded in raising a small crop of Brazilian or Cuban tobacco. A stalk on display in a Winchester store is over six feet in length and is a fair sample of this kind of tobacco. The leaves are not as large as Burley, but the fibre is small and the body is of fine texture.

Look Who's Here.

Uncle Joe Cannon may possibly "come back," now that he has obtained a nomination in his Congressional district, but it is safe to say that Cannonism will never be revived at Washington. That passed away when the autocratic Speaker was stripped of much of his authority by a combination of Democrats and Independent Republicans, and there has never since been any disposition to go back to the old ways. In view of the fact that Mr. Cannon's contemptuous scorn of everything that is decent in politics had much to do with his party's overthrow.

The Election in Kentucky

In November more than thirty United States Senators are to be elected and upon this election depends whether the Senate shall remain Democratic or whether it shall become Republican. Most of the States where there is a Senatorial election have only one Senator to name, but Kentucky has two. The Democrats of Kentucky have therefore a double responsibility. Should the Democrats in this State fail in their duty it would seriously handicap President Wilson's administration. It is even possible that upon the election in Kentucky may depend the control of the Senate. No good Democrat can afford to take this chance by either staying away from the polls or by failing to support Beckham and Camden, our two senatorial nominees.

We believe that President Wilson's administration is worthy of the most hearty endorsement by the Democratic party. He has accomplished more good for the country in the way of wise legislation in the part of his term than any of his predecessors in half a century have ever done in a full term.

We believe that the Democrats of Kentucky desire to put the stamp of their approval upon Wilson. The only way they can do this in November will be by putting the stamp under the rooster. A vote for the Democratic ticket this fall is a vote of confidence and approval of the administration at Washington. A vote against the Democratic ticket this fall is a vote of condemnation of Wilson's administration. — Elizabethtown News.
