Dying, Tells of Fortune Buried 50 Years Ago.

The hiding place of \$1,480 in money, which had been hidden presumably since the Civil War, was disclosed by Mrs. Thos. Franklin, of Hopkinsville, just before her death.

Following her instructions relatives went to the well house in the yard at her home and recovered the money. About \$1,000 of it was in greenbacks, \$400 in silver and \$80 in gold.

Mrs. Franklin was 77 years old and was born and spent her life in Trigg county. It was generally known that she had money secreted some where about the place, but she never told anyone where it was hidden till just before her death.

The money was in a box, which was in a good state of preservation, despite its long burial. Mrs. Franklin is survived by several relatives.—Exchange.
