NEW NAVY BOARD IS ANNOUNCED Experts Will Study Country's Marine Problems.

Edison Will Head Body First Meeting of Scientific Inventors Will Be Held Oct. 6—Members Were Chosen by Various Societies of the United States.

Washington, Sept. 13.—The names of the twenty-two scientists and inventors, who, with Thomas A. Edison as chairman, are to constitute an advisory board to assist the United States navy in its technical problems of development, have been announced by Secretary of the Navy Daniels.

Mr. Daniels announced that he has arranged for the first meeting of the board to take place in his office at 11 o'clock on Wednesday, Oct. 6. At this meeting it is expected that the organization will be effected and plans for the conduct of its work discussed.

Mr. Daniels made the following statement regarding the board and the purposes for which it has been created:

"Desiring to make available the latest scientific genius of our country to improve our navy, short time ago I requested Mr. Thomas A. Edison to become chairman of an advisory board of eminent men, who would make up the board.

The responses of the various societies invited to co-operate in the great undertaking indicate the patriotic enthusiasm awakened by this call to duty.

The naval advisory board will consist of the following men, each society naming two: Thomas Edison, chairman. American Chemical Society, W. R. Whitney and L. H. Baekeland.

American Society of Mechanical Engineers, William Leroy Emmet and Spencer Miller. American Society of Aeronautic Engineers, Henry A. W. Wood and Elmer A. Spencer.

VON PAPEN WILL FOLLOW DUMBA Recall of Attache to German Embassy Arranged.

It is Already Announced He is "Taking a Vacation"—Bernstorff Holds Conference With Lansing—Dumba Incident About Closed.

Washington, Sept. 13.—That the departure of Captain Franz von Papen, military attache of the German embassy has been arranged for is indicated here.

The viewpoint of the United States government as regards Captain von Papen is thoroughly appreciated in Germany, where the attitude of this government is understood, and there is a desire to meet the wishes of the American government.

On the other hand, the administration is not desirous of making trouble and hence is reluctant to dismiss him pre-emptorily from his post at the German embassy here.

There is good reason to believe, therefore, that Count von Bernstorff, the German ambassador, is likely soon to reach the conclusion that the interests of both governments will best be served by relieving Captain von Papen of his attachment to the embassy in this country.

It is understood that the only condition which will be attached to the relief of von Papen is that the United States government exert itself to secure a safe conduct for the captain.

Most earnest efforts to remove the present serious obstacles in the way of a settlement of the submarine controversy between the United States and Germany are expected to result from the conference.

On the other hand it may be stated that the difficulty from the American point of view is the doubt which has been cast on the good faith of Germany by contrast between certain acts of her submarine commanders and the pledges given by Germany and its ambassador here.

SLAVS HOLDING GERMAN CHECK Austro-Hungarians Try to Strike Blow.

Teutons Make Little or No Progress Toward Their Main Objective, Rigas—Russians Take 2,500 Prisoners and Destroy Battalion.

London, Sept. 13.—The Russian war office official statement, an exhaustive resume, covering practically every essential sector of the front in Galicia, Poland and Russia proper, permits of but one conclusion, that the czar's forces are no longer "continuously retreating," but that they have, in a determined and, virtually along the whole front, checking the onrush of the Austro-Hungarian armies almost everywhere and pushing thus far a successful offensive in Galicia.

Only at one point does the official Russian war bulletin admit success on the part of the Teutonic adversaries, namely, in the district east of Vilkomir, northeast of the captured fortress of Kovno, and not far from the Vilna-Dvinsk-Petrograd railroad.

As for the rest of the entire front, however, Petrograd, in summing up the situation, asserts that the Austrians and Germans have been "driven from one part of the line to the other in an effort to strike a decisive blow."
