Byron Juetts Goes Suddenly To Join Absent Brothers Whose Names He Called Sunday

Last Sunday at the annual memorial services of the local lodge of Odd Fellows, the names of the "absent brothers" who have crossed the dark river of death, were called out in impressive tones, by Byron Juetts, one of the most prominent members of this order...

Death came quickly and suddenly to this esteemed citizen and well known business man of Richmond. He had gone out in the East End of the city to see about about a painting order for Mrs. Smith. She stepped into the house to change a \$5 bill. While inside she heard a heavy fall, and when she hastened out, Mr. Juetts was lying dead on the porch. Heart disease is believed to have been the cause of his sudden death.

Mr. Juetts was 61 years of age. He had been in the wall paper and painting business for many years and was highly honored and esteemed by everyone. He is survived by his wife and two children, one son, Reed Juetts, and a daughter, Mrs. Clarence Elmore, of Paris, and a sister, Mrs. Milburn, of Ohio.

There was no more enthusiastic Odd Fellow in the state than he. He had held all of the chairs in the local lodge and had also been honored with state office in the Grand Lodge. He was likewise a devoted member of the Methodist church, a consecrated christian, and those who knew his life, know that he was ready to go, no matter how sudden the summons. He was assistant superintendent of the Methodist Sunday School and greatly interested in its work.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock. The religious services will be conducted by his pastor, Rev. M. T. Chandler, and the burial ritual of Odd Fellows will also be used.
