Ohio and New York
 Auditorium, San Francisco, July 7.—The completion of the Democratic national ticket yesterday by the nomination of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, assistant secretary of the navy, for the vice presidency as running mate to Governor Cox, of Ohio, the presidential nominee, led reminiscent political observers to point of the fact that combinations of the Buckeye and Empire states has been a winner in four presidential elections.

TEACHERS LEAVE TO TAKE UP WORK

It is estimated that more than 100 school teachers, mostly young women from the city of Richmond, who have been instructing in schools throughout the state last term, and who have been at their homes during the summer vacation, have practically all decided to resume their work in other counties and cities, and the exodus has begun.

Many of those here have certificates either for a number of years or for life, and are experienced teachers from the elementary grades up. The various county schools of the state are beginning, several resuming work on Monday. There are many to start next week, and there will be another big list of Richmond teachers take their departure. The invasion of school superintendents from other counties have made inroads, it is said, upon the quota of teachers here, and this is one of the reasons for the local shortage. Many of the instructors show an inclination to go away from their home county, especially for their first term.

The Madison schools, colored, will be opened on next Monday morning for the usual period. Practically all of the teachers have been procured. There are 23 colored schools in the county and this is an important factor in the educational field. There are many aspirants for places as teachers. However, this condition does not apply to the white schools, which will open one week from Monday. The members of the school board have never been confronted with just a situation, it having been learned that many of the local instructors have been promised more salary elsewhere after they had practically decided to teach in the home district, and have changed their minds and taken positions elsewhere.
