**SCHOOL TEACHERS SING BATTLE HYMNS**  
 Extensive Program At All-Day Meeting Saturday—Many Instructors Took Part

Battle hymns of the republic were sung at the meeting of the Madison County Teachers' Association at the court house Saturday before its close and for some time the nature of the event would have been misconstrued by some for a patriotic meeting, perhaps of veterans, had it not been for the fact that the assemblage was principally of young women, representing the bulk of teachers of the schools of the county.

This original feature was injected by President Miss Anna Powell of the organization for the purpose of impressing the importance of music in the schools. Superintendent B. F. Edwards, who called the meeting to order, turned the session over to Miss Powell, who caused a rousing enthusiasm by her keen interest and original ideas. She delivered an inspiring address upon the importance of conducting devotional exercises. She adhered to the appropriate song policy and repeated Biblical sayings with her talk, adding to the interest of the discourse which was taken up by the teachers in full.

"How to teach boys and girls how to study," was the theme upon which Prof. Paris B. Alin addressed the big assemblage. He advocated home study to a great extent where necessary, and solicited the aid upon the part of parents in showing the students and younger ones how to embrace the various puzzling problems with which the youngster is confronted.

Prof. S. S. Myers, of Eastern Normal, was in attendance and conducted the singing of "rote songs." Miss Pearl Hicks rendered a solo that proved an enjoyable feature to this part of the meeting.

Cosby Duncan, teacher at Valley View, spoke upon the inspirational side of the meeting.

Superintendent Edwards introduced the new county truancy officer, W. A. Johnson, of Berea, who enters upon his work this week. Mr. Edwards also explained the truancy law and said he would give an address on "The Live Teacher" later on.

Prof. Campbell, city superintendent of Irvine, gave a splendid talk and emphasized many of the points already made and gave several new ideas.

Mrs. Carnes, of Big Hill, gave a short talk, explaining the good being done there, as did Prof. Fitzgerald, of the Kirksville school, and others.
