

## NELSON COUNTY COW CHAMPION

(By Associated Press)  
Lexington, Ky., Dec. 21—Oakwood Segs DeKol Johanna, an 8 year old Holstein cow, owned by the Kentucky Holstein Farm, Bardstown, has become the official champion producer of milk and butter among Kentucky cows, according to J. J. Hooper, head of the dairy department of the College of Agriculture.  
During the twelve months she was tested under the direction of the college dairy department, she produced 24,907 pounds of milk and 825 pounds of butterfat, or close to the 1,000 pounds of butter. The record has just been verified by the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.  
The honor which has just been won by the Nelson county cow previously was held for four years by Fairy Lady Sally, a Jersey, owned by the Allen Dale Farm, Shelbyville. She had a record of 822 pounds of butterfat produced in a year.  
The new state champion is a good example of what good feed and are will do in boosting the milk and butterfat production of cows, Mr. Hooper, say. During the time that she was making her record, she was under the care of Morris H. Halpern, herdsman at the Kentucky Holstein Farm and a former student in the winter short course in practical agriculture given each year at the college. She was milked four times a day and completed her record at midnight, November 23, immediately after which the figures were sent to the Holstein association to be authenticated. The record that she has made is considered one of the best that has ever been completed in this section of the country.  
The new record is some indication of what can be expected from dairy cows, provided they are given good care and fed right, Mrs. Hooper pointed out. At the present time the average cow in the state is producing an average of 2750 pounds of milk and 135 pounds of butterfat a year. This could be increased to at least 250 pounds of fat a year for more than half the dairy cows in the state if they received care similar to that which was given the new state champion, he says.
