### STEPS TOWARD PEACE.

America is ship independent. America needs no longer turn to any other country for assistance so far as her merchant marine needs would dictate. As Chief of Naval Operations during the war, Admiral Benson truthfully says this ship independence of America spells another step in the direction of peace promotion. Those who know the importance of an auxiliary navy will appreciate the position we found ourselves in, when in 1914 the war dogs were let loose in Europe and the earth shook because of the conflict which reached into practically every family of this world. And it is well for America that this thoroughgoing American citizen was at the helm when this independence was attacked by foreign intrigue.

### CONVENTION AT WASHINGTON.

October 12 in Washington will be called in session the first annual convention of the National Council of Catholic Women, with Mrs. Michael J. Gavin, National President, in the chair. Miss Camille Detert, of this city, who has been in Washington for months working for the National Council, brings word that the convention will be an important one, as women's welfare work in this country and abroad will be furthered.

### ARCHBISHOP OF BALTIMORE.

The Right Rev. Michael J. Curley, just appointed Archbishop of Baltimore, was born at Golden Island, Athlone, Ireland, October 12, 1878. He received the bachelor of arts degree at the Royal University of Ireland in 1900. He then went to Rome, Italy, where he entered the College of the Propaganda. There he was given his bachelor of divinity in 1901, and the licentiate of sacred theology in 1903. He was ordained to the priesthood March 19, 1904, and was then assigned to missionary work in Florida. After twenty years of service he was consecrated Bishop of St. Augustine.

### SIXTEEN LEAVING.

Sixteen more missionaries, including eleven priests, will sail up the Yangtze river next autumn to join their companions in Hon Yang and

### the interior stations. This will be a substantial addition in numbers, and means a big widening of activities. It will bring the Chinese Mission Society total staff of workers in the entire district up to thirty-five (without including the native catechists), a not inconsiderable number at first sight, but still small indeed for the task before them. Yet each year will see the figures climb and the harvest increase in proportion. Meanwhile the immediate concern is to see that all who are there or will soon be there, are so provided for that their work on the field may be maintained at the highest state of efficiency. Any who can or will help in this work for the conversion of China should correspond with Rev. Edward J. McCarthy, St. Columban's Mission House, Omaha, Neb.

### UNIVERSITY STADIUM.

Work on the stadium at the Catholic University, Washington, D. C., will be undertaken next autumn. It has been decided by the committee which the lay alumni association of the institution has appointed to take charge of the project. It is expected that the stadium will cost about \$1,000,000.

### INTO THE FOLD.

The wife and daughter of the distinguished convert, Dr. Frederick J. Kinsman, former Episcopal Bishop of Delaware, have been received into the church.

### MAKING AD LIMINA.

Right Rev. James A. Duffy, Bishop of the Grand Island diocese, sailed for Rome this week. Bishop Duffy was accompanied by Rev. Anton Link, pastor of Sidney.

### HISTORY OF AMERICA.

America is the happy hunting ground of foreign propagandists who have penetrated press, pulpit, and most outrageous invasion of all public schools. So-called historians have applied the soft pedal of apology to the hard facts of Colonial and Revolutionary history. A hundred and one offenses against sovereign truth have been committed in the name of the Anglo-Saxon and other hybrid impulses. The Knights of Columbus have determined to fight this menace to American culture with a history movement conducted by experts who know American history and who, in the words of Edward F. McSweeney, an indefatigable student of international history and a recognized authority, will provide "a history of the American people by the American people for the American people."—Columbia.

### GREAT CATHOLIC EVENT.

Announcement was made at the Cathedral rectory the past week that the installation of Right Rev. Joseph Schrembs, as fifth Bishop of Cleveland, will take place in St. John Cathedral on Thursday, September 8. It is expected that the largest number of the hierarchy ever gathered in Cleveland will be present to witness the installation of Bishop Schrembs. Invitations will be sent to the two American Cardinals and to all the Archbishops and Bishops in the United States. Archbishop Moeller, of Cincinnati, will do doubt preach the sermon.

### TERRIBLE INDICTMENT.

Says the current number of the Gaelic Churchman, Dublin, the organ of the Irish Guild of the Church (Protestant): "We have received so many letters from correspondents in the North that we are unable to do more than give some extracts from them. One and all deplore the way the clergy of the Church of Ireland used their pulpits to further the election of the Unionist candidates. From other parts also comes the same tale that the Protestant clergy are so obsessed by politics that they have left off preaching Christ. It is a terrible indictment, and we should be only too glad if we could believe that there was no justification for it."
