**Hemp Bringing Good Prices.**

Hemp has touched a higher figure than in years. It is selling now for \$5.75 per 112 pounds. The highest price quoted in 1905 was \$5, says the Jessamine News. Several causes have contributed to the bringing about the result. In Kentucky the amount of ground planted in hemp has been steadily on the decline. In 1905 twenty five per cent less land was planted than in 1904, and this year fully twenty-five per cent less than last season. The increase in the price of hemp has been the principal cause of the smaller acreage planted each year. It has also proved more difficult each season a care satisfactory labor to handle the crop. And in many parts of this section the broom rape has caused a great deal of trouble to the planter.
