The Virginia Launched.

In the presence of 30,000 people the magnificent new battleship Virginia was launched at Newport News, Va., last week. She belongs to a class of five mammoth ships authorized by Congress in the two years immediately following the Spanish-American war. She is of 15,000 displacement, length on load water line 435 feet, breadth extreme at load water line 76 feet 2 1/2 inches, draught with full load about 26 feet. The Virginia will have speed of 10 knots, which is regarded as remarkable, considering her immense size. Her total cost is about \$8,000,000.

St. Louis, April 6.—After investigating and holding a meeting to discuss the intentions expressed by those having in charge the savage Igorrotes from the Philippine Islands, to furnish the savages with dogs for food during the Worlds Fair, the Human Society of St. Louis today formally gave notification that prosecution would follow every attempt to furnish dogs as food. The society said that if the Igorrotes must have dog meat it must be imported in cans from their native land.

The Martha H. Hennen.
The Martha H. Hennen, a new towboat, stands nearly completed at the wharf at Evansville. The boat was originally built at Hawesville in 1900, and belonged to the Cincinnati Cooperative company. She then bore the name of L. H. Buhrman. About this time last year she was burned near Stephensport and the Hennen Bros., the present owners, bought the wreck of the salvage company. The hull and boilers were practically uninjured. As reconstructed she is 117 feet long with a breadth of 23 feet and double decked. The owners expect to have her finished by April 15, and they intend to put her on the Green river trade as a towboat.
