I have very full reports from eighty-three counties, embracing the principal agricultural portion of the State. These reports were received from the 20th to the 25th May. In many of the counties, at the date of these reports, but little rain had fallen during March, April and the early part of May.

The ground is now thoroughly wet and the humidity of the atmosphere promises a lasting season. From all the reports received we deduce the following facts: TOBACCO. Bowling Green vicinity on the 30th, fifty per cent. of an average crop set, with only ten per cent. remaining to be set.

WHEAT. Early in the spring the wheat never looked better, but the continued drought, Hessian fly, smut and chinch bug all combined to materially injure it.
