Victim of the Assault Declined to Seek Redress, but Committed Suicide Soon After.

Lexington, Ky., Feb. 14.-J. J Cornelison, formerly of Mt. Sterling, whose assault upon Appellate Judge Richard Reid, fifteen years ago caused Reid to commit suicide died his home in Lexington this meening.

Judge Reid was a judge of the Court of Appeals and a candidate for re-election.

J. J. Cornelison had been defeated in long litigation by a final opinion from the highest State court, and he held Judge Reid responsible for the decision.

Judge Reid was conducting a successful canvass for re-election. He was a gentleman of high personal character, and a Judge above reproach.

Cornelison invited Reid into a room alone for a conference on a legal point, and then drew a horse whip or cowhide and struck the Judge rapidly and violently, finally overcoming all resistance on the part of Reid and left him bruised and bleeding.

The assault caused profound excitement in the State, deeper even than did Buford's killing of Ellis. Reid refused to follow Cornelison, for his whole soul revolted against strife.

But though he could not take the life of his assailant, the assault prayed on his mind sothat he would not face his friends or the public, and finally he took his own life.

This tragedy was followed by various trials of Cornelison; by fine and imprisonment for a short period, but after a time he was released. Before his assault upon Reid. Cornelison had a promise of me success at the bar, but he never recovered his position, and gradually he disappeared from the public gaze.

LENT IS HERE.

What Good Catholics Are Permit , ted To Eat.

Lent began Wednesday and will be observed by the members of several religious denominations for forty days.

The Catholic churches prescribe certain rules and the following dispensations are granted by the Holy Lee:

1. The use of flesh-meat, as also of eggs, is permitted at every meal on the Sundays of lent, and at the principal meal on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, with the exception of Saturday in Ember week and Holy Saturday.

2. Custom also allows the use of eggs, butter milk, etc., at the evening collation, and also at the principal meal on the days on which the use of flesh-meat is forbidden.

3. The quality of the food allowed at a collation in this diocese is bread, salads, vegetables and cold

4. A small piece of bread with a cup of coffee, tea or chocolate, can be taken in the morning.

5. Where it is not convenient take the principal meal at noon, it is lawful to invert the order, and take collation in the morning and dinner in the evening.

6. Drippings and lard may be used in the preparation of the kinds of food which are permitted.

7. On Sunday there is neither fasting nor abstinence, but fish cannot be used with flesh-meat at the same meal at any Sunday dur-

8. Those who are exempt from he precept of fasting can partake of flesh-meat at every meal during the day when, by special indult flesh-meat is permitted at the prin-


