SUIT OVER DEWEY'S NOSE.

Certain Medallions Alleged to Disfigure the Admiral's Countenance.

A suit at law has been instituted which depends for settlement upon the question, "Has Admiral Dewey a wart on his nose?" The plaintiffs are Whitehead & Hoag, New Jersey, who make medallions, and the defendants are Griesheimer & Co., of Chicago, who ordered 5,000 numismatic presentations of the "man of Manila."

When the medallions were examined it was found that upon the nose of the metal miniatures there was a wart, which appeared not in any previous limning of the admiral. Mr. Griesheimer immediately telegraphed to President McKinley, Mrs. Dewey, Admiral Montejó and Secretary Long of the navy department, asking earnestly and in set terms whether there was a wart, carbuncle, mole or other excrescence upon the admirable nose of the admiral.

All agreed by wire, at Griesheimer's expense, that the hero's nose was as smooth as "they make 'em." Then the Chicago man refused to pay the bill, and the suit followed.

Capt. Sigbee confirmed the reputation of the admiral's nose, and said:—"There is no inequality on Admiral Dewey's face. Indeed, he is one of the most polished—" And then the train pulled out.

Jersey After The Trusts.

New Jersey seems to be anxious to kill the hen that laid it so many golden eggs. A bill pending in the legislature has amazed the promoters of the \$2,000,000,000 worth of trusts organized under New Jersey laws. The bill requires New Jersey corporations to report certain facts, to-wit: All directors of any concern neglecting to file a report as required shall be ineligible to election as a director, or to hold any other office in such corporation.

The theory behind the bill is that it is a step toward that "publicity" recommended by friends as well as by enemies of the trusts.

The matters on which a report to the secretary of state in the pending bill are:

Capital authorized, how much? Capital outstanding, how much? Annual meeting, when next to be held?

The proposed law also requires each company to certify that it has had a signature of registered officials in New Jersey, and also a list of stockholders names and addresses accessible to all stockholders at any time.

Dr. Preston B. Scott, of the Orphan Brigade, reports that the Medical Department had secured the Scottish Rite Cathedral as headquarters, and that there would be in Louisville at the Confederate Reunion, May 30-31, June 1-1-3, the largest attendance of Confederate surgeons and distinguished physicians from New York, St. Louis and other Northern cities, who would be present to read papers on their experiences as surgeons in the Confederate army.

As Louisville is connected with 18,000 miles of navigable water, it is expected that many river excursions will be arranged during the Confederate Reunion there, May 30-31, June 1-2-3. Among the boats to be used in the excursion service will be the famous five-deck steamer from Cincinnati.

The souvenir badge of the Confederate Reunion at Louisville, May 30-June 3, will be a celluloid canteen with the profile of Winnie Davis, daughter of the Confederacy, on one side and the Winnie Davis rose on the other.

Mississippi has secured headquarters at 121 W. Main street. It will be handsomely decorated and furnished and banner bearing the words "Headquarters, State of Mississippi," will span Main street.

One of the first banks to send a contribution, a check for \$100, to the Confederate Veterans' Fund Committee was the Southern National—Ch'm. Bennett H. Young's bank.

Louisville never had a more generally popular job on her hands than that of fixing to receive and entertain the old Confederate "war scars" this May.


