JOHN RHEA STONED.

Verkesites of Taylor's County Attempt To Assassinate The Democratic Leader.

Bowling Green, Ky., Sept. 11.—Congressman John Rhea, who arrived here late last night, reports that he was stoned on the road by a crowd of men. He had delivered an address at Morgantown yesterday, and the attack followed the speech. Mr. Rhea scored Taylor and Whittaker as assassins. Though matters seemed torrid for a while, Mr. Rhea escaped without injury.

THE VERMONT ELECTION.

Additional Returns Keep Up Ratio of Democratic Gain.

White River, Vt., Sept. 5.—Returns from 232 cities and towns out of 246 cities and towns in the State give the vote for Governor as follows:

Stickey (Rep.), 46,934; Senter (Dem.), 15,494; all others, 1,268. The same towns in 1896 gave Grout (Rep.), 52,029; Jackson (Dem.), 14,556; all others, 1,589. The Republican loss is 9 per cent., and the Democratic gain is 15 per cent.

4,000 Dogs Killed in a Year.

According to the annual reports of the pound keepers filed with the Board of Safety over 4,000 dogs were officially killed in Louisville during the fiscal year ended August 31. In the Eastern district Toney Steltenkamp reported 2,184 dogs taken in. He smothered 2,116 according to law and 68 were redeemed by owners. In the Western district John C. Abraham reported 2,061 dogs impounded, 1,947 smothered and 112 redeemed.

In the same districts 141 horses were taken up. All were redeemed except one, which was ordered killed on application of the Humane Society.

As Mistress of the Mansion.

Frankfort Ky., Sept. 5.—Mrs. Julia Wickoff Beckham, the mother of the Gov. arrived here tonight to take charge of the mansion. This does not look like Beckham has any idea of being defeated in November. It is strongly intimated that the Governor's mother will be succeeded by another Mrs. Beckham as mistress of the mansion. Mrs. Beckham was accompanied by her daughter, Mrs. W. B. Kinslern, of Chicago, who will remain a short time to visit her brother the Governor.

Such a ticket to be good for the journey to Chicago during the four days preceding, and the day of, the meeting and for the return journey from Chicago, only on the day of the meeting and the four days immediately following, when properly countersigned and stamped during business hours—that is to say, 9.00 A. M. and 5.00 P. M. in the office of Assistant Secretary Mr. W. G. Bruen, in Chicago. Such a ticket may be obtained by any registered stockholder on application in writing to the President of the Company in Chicago. Each application must state the full name and address of the stockholder exactly as given on his or her certificate of stock, together with the number and date of such certificate. No more than one person will be carried free in respect to any one holding of stock as registered on the books of the Company.




