There will be six Smiths in the next Congress, with several States to hear from in Senatorial races.

Rear Admiral F. V. McNair, Senior Rear Admiral of the Navy, died in Washington last week while on waiting orders.

Vice-President-elect Roosevelt is going to Colorado to hunt mountain lions, but the President will continue to hobnob with the British Lion.

The ship subsidy bill, one of Hanna's favorite looting schemes, is up for consideration in the Senate and its advocates claim that the subsidy will be only (?) \$9,000,000. There is no talk of giving subsidies to those too poor to own ships.

There is a big scramble on in Hopkins county for the Democratic nominations for county offices. The Hustler is already carrying 20 announcements, including that of its own editor, Mr. C. C. Givens, who wants to be county judge.

E. E. Sallee committed suicide at Lexington after fatally wounding his wife, Mamie Webster Sallee, who had recently fallen heir to \$5,000, left her by the noted turf character, Lawson Webster. Mrs. Sallee died the next day.

After tendering the appointment of Senator to several Republicans who declined, Gov. Lind, of Minnesota, appointed Hon. Chas. A. Towne to the vacancy caused by Senator Davis' death. He will serve only a month or two, until his Republican successor is elected by the Legislature.

The ministers at Pekin have at last reached a final agreement. The views of the United States prevail as to punishments and indemnity and the punishments are to be the severest inflicted by the Chinese government. On other points the French proposition formed the basis of the agreement. In the meantime the Governor of Shan-Si has already beheaded 80 rebel leaders.

When Gov. Beckham vacates the office of Lieutenant Governor to become Governor next week, a vacancy will be created in the former office. Lawyers do not agree upon the question of whether or not the vacancy is to be filled by election next year. President Carter, of the Senate, will be acting Governor until the end of his term a year hence, at which time, in the event no election is held, a new Republican President of the Senate will almost surely be chosen, who would become Governor in the event of Gov. Beckham's assassination.

Mr. J. A. Fuqua, Governor Beckham's father-in-law, is one of five candidates for County Court Clerk of Daviess county, subject to the action of the Democratic party. Josh T. Griffith has held this office for many years and is a candidate for re-election. It is not likely that any candidate, or field of candidates, however popular or influential, will be strong enough to shake the hold that Josh Griffith has upon the Democrats of Daviess county, whose leader he has been for fifteen years.

**REPUBLICAN EFFORTS**

To Get Cases Set Over Until The New Court.

Frankfort, Ky., Dec. 4.—In the court of appeals this morning the attorneys for the Republican contestants for the minor State offices filed affidavits to the effect that they had objected to the submission of the case on its merits, and asked that the records so show.

This is taken as an indication that the Republicans intend to try to get the case before the new court when Judge O'Rear gets on the bench, and that they will ask the court then to review it. The objection was overruled at the time and the case passed on.

The case of Jim Howard was called in the court of appeals this morning and set down for hearing on Friday, the 4th inst.

Judge George Denny, of Lexington, made a further play for delay in the Powers case. He entered a motion to be given until December 15 to file a brief. The court will pass on the motion to-morrow.
