### MORE OIL.

The Fluid Flowing From Banks of Little River.

What is Supposed to be a Rich Find Reported From Near Herndon.

What is supposed to be a rich find of oil is that reported from near Herndon. The find was made on the west bank of Little River, where a "wet weather" creek empties into the stream. Oil is now flowing from the banks of the river and covers the water for some distance out into the stream. The land on which the surface indications are so prominent belongs to Mr. R. C. Pace and is surrounded by some very hilly country. A near-by spring has become so impregnated with oil that the water is unfit for use.

An expert has been going over the property with a view of ascertaining its value as an oil producing factor and samples of the fluid will be sent to a chemist for analysis.

It is said that the present indications are almost conclusive that oil will be found in paying quantities.

### EARTHQUAKE

Utterly Demolishes the Little Town of Cilpancingo, Mexico.

Six People Swallowed up by The Yawning Earth.

City of Mexico, Jan. 17.—Reports from the earthquake at Cilpancingo, Mex., yesterday indicate that the destruction was complete over a wide area. The city named was destroyed, not a single building in it remaining. Six of the inhabitants are reported killed and many others injured. Everything that could be utilized by the survivors to live on has been destroyed and the growing crops are nearly all ruined.

Other towns and villages in the same region suffered very severely, and it is believed that government aid will have to be extended to the stricken people.

### BEAUTIFUL LIFE

Ended When Mrs. Elizabeth S. M. McGee Died.

Bennetts town, Ky., Jan. 20.—Mrs. Elizabeth Susan Miles McGee, wife of Mr. George Washington McGee, died at her home near this place, January 14, of pneumonia. She had not enjoyed good health for about two years, but only lived a few days after pneumonia developed. Deceased was born May 29, 1836, in Cheatham county, Tenn., and moved to Kentucky with her parents, John and Mary Miles, when thirteen years of age.

She professed faith in Christ at the age of fifteen and united with Little River Baptist church, remaining a consistent member until death.

She was married to G. W. McGee, Jan. 15, 1857, and eight children were born as a result of the union. The first was a daughter, who died in infancy. The other seven lived to be grown and six of them, five sons and a daughter, are still living. S. B. McGee, the second son, died Feb. 2, 1897.

Mrs. McGee's life was characterized by a tender devotion to her husband and children; beautiful by reason of its spirit of self-sacrifice and deep consecration to the interests of her family. Her death leaves a chasm in the life of her family which can never be filled and her loss will also be deeply mourned by a large circle of friends.

Besides six children Mrs. McGee is survived by a husband, who is about 75 years old.

The remains were laid to rest in the family burying ground last Wednesday. Services were held by Revs. Dorris, of Lafayette, and I. G. Joiner, of near this place.
