EDITORS ACCEPT. Invitation of Kentucky Exhibit Association.

Louisville, Ky, Nov. 8—Kentucky Day at the World's fair will be Thursday, June 2, 1904, and the Kentucky Press Association will be present as the guests of the Kentucky Exhibit Association. These two important matters were settled yesterday afternoon at a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Press Association held at the Galt House here, where President A. Y. Ford and Secretary R. E. Hughes, of the Exhibit Association renewed the invitation extended at the last annual meeting of the Press Association held at Lexington.

There were present the following editors: President Paul M. Moore of the Earlington Bee; Vice President Louis Landrum of the Lancaster Record, Secretary R. E. Morningstar, of the Bowling Green News; and Executive committeemen T. C. Underwood, of the Hopkinsville New Era, and R. W. Brown, of the Louisville Times. President Moore reads an invitation from Walter Williams, commissioner to the Foreign Press for the Exposition, urging the Kentucky editors to attend the world's Fair during Press Parliament week, beginning May the 16, Mr. Ford then stated the desire of the Kentucky Exhibit Association to have the newspaper men to come to St. Louis on Kentucky Day, which would be fixed for a time to suit the Press Association. He said Thursday, June 2, had been suggested, as it is Kentucky's natal day. It was forthwith unanimously voted that the invitation of the Exhibit Association be accepted. President Moore was authorized to consult with President Ford relative to the date. This conference resulted in the selection of June 2.

It was then decided that delegates from the Press Association be appointed to represent the organization at the exposition during Press Parliament week, a fortnight before Kentucky Day, and President Moore was clothed with authority to name this delegation. A committee to visit St. Louis, early in December to arrange with the exposition officials details as to the entertainment of the delegates during Press Parliament week and entire Association Kentucky Day appointed consisting of Messrs Moore, Landrum, Underwood and Hughes.

The coming mid winter meeting of the Press Association was next discussed. It was agreed that this meeting be held Friday, Dec. 11, 1903. The first committee will go to St. Louis the week prior to the mid winter meeting and give a full report at the meeting, when President Moore will also announce the delegates to the Press Parliament. The Henderson route extended through its Traveling Passenger Agent an invitation to the Press Association to go to the exposition on Kentucky Day, via its system, and the invitation was accepted. The business meeting will be held in Louisville May 30, to June 1. One of the State's best brass bands will accompany the Association to the exposition.
