NEW CONCERN

President of New Company
A Hopkinsville Man.

A deal was closed at Paducah Thursday morning by which Paducah and Hopkinsville people absorb the property and business of the "West Kentucky Stone Co.," located at Elkton, and incorporated a new company, with the main office located in Paducah. The officers are as follows: President, L. Haydon, Hopkinsville; Vice President, Samuel Givens, Paducah; Secretary and Treasurer, R. R. Winston, Paducah; Superintendent and General Manager Mines, A. R. Givens, Paducah. The News-Democrat says:

"The deal has been on for several weeks, during which time, experts from this city, Louisville, Nashville and Memphis, have examined the property and stone, and pronounce it the finest building stone property in the South—equal in every respect to the famous Bedford stone of Indiana. This resulted in the company's placing contracts ahead of them in the above named cities for all the stone they can mine and ship for the next ten years.

The property is situated in sight of the town of Elkton, Todd county, within easy reach of the L. & N. R. R. and immediately on the line of the Cairo and Cumberland Gap R. R. now under contract and construction, which will, when completed, give the stone company two railroad outlets for their product.

Superintendent A. R. Givens will at once increase the force at the mines and soon be shipping stone by the train load over the L. & N. R. R.

One of the experts who examined this property states that it has on it a solid mountain of stone that will require a century of years to mine and ship to market."
