

### AMAZE CONSERVATIVES

#### Legislature Has Passed \$2,000,000 Mark, and May Add \$500,000 to This Sum.

Frankfort, Ky., March 13.— On the eve of the adjournment of the Kentucky Legislature the total appropriations amount to more than \$2,000,000, and the sum may reach \$2,500,000. Most of the appropriating has been done by the Senate. The House has only appropriated half a million dollars, which was for the State colleges and normal schools.

Conservative members of the Legislature are amazed over the extravagance.
