### COLD WAVE

#### Enroute And is Due to Reach Kentucky Today.

Colder weather is coming. The following special forecast has been sent out from Washington:

"A storm that now occupies the North Pacific coast will move southward over the Rocky Mountains Sunday and thence eastward over the plains States Monday and Tuesday and reach the Atlantic coast about Wednesday, attended by snow in the middle and northern districts, and followed by a cold wave that will appear over the Northwestern States Sunday or Monday, advance over the central valleys and lake region Monday and Tuesday and reach the Atlantic States about the middle of the week."

### Many Indictments.

Clarksville, Tenn., Feb. 5.—The grand jury which has just adjourned held a long session and returned many indictments. Hundreds of witnesses from different parts of the county were summoned to appear before it, and as a result of the investigations 163 indictments were returned, among them being the following: Violating kluks law, six; assault to kill, three; murder, one, assault, seven; conspiracy, twenty-six.

### LIFE BEGINS AT BIRTH

#### Declares St. Louis Judge in Damage Case.

St. Louis, Mo., Feb. 6.—Circuit Court Judge Williams, in a decision which was put on record today, held that a child's life begins at birth and not before. In sustaining suit of Cornelius H. Buel and his wife for damages for the death of their four-months old son, who, it was claimed, died as a result of an accident which occurred before he was born Judge Williams based his ruling upon a part of the Scriptures. He quoted Genesis II:7.

The demurrer averred the child in the meaning of the law was not a person at the time Mrs. Buel was injured, five months before the baby was born.

### Insulted A White Girl.

Pittsburg, Feb. 8.—Serious trouble growing out of the police crusade against negroes who have terrorized the Herron Hill district by frequently assaulting young white girls, was narrowly averted when John Moulton, a negro, thirty-nine years old, was arrested in the East End district on a charge that he had annoyed a white girl and had accosted her with "Good evening, sweetheart; ain't you going to kiss me?"

Moulton was given a hearing today before a Police Magistrate, who sentenced him to six months in Workhouse without a fine.

### CHURCHES WILL UNITE.

#### Northern and Southern Congregations to Consolidate.

Shelbyville, Ky., Feb. 8.—The Northern and Southern Presbyterian churches in Shelbyville have about completed all the details of the plan to unite and in the future have but one church, to be known as the First Presbyterian church.

Articles of agreement have been drawn up making disposition of the church property and asking the two Presbyteries to sanction the union. If all consent the union will become effective on April 1.

As a step to the consolidation, the Rev. J. Rockwell Smith, pastor of the Assembly church, the Northern congregations be dissolved, in which request the members have united.

### STATE TROOPS

#### To Protect Browder, Who is Being Tried for Murder.

Russellville, Ky., Feb. 8.—A company of State militia from Bowling Green is here with the negro, Rufus Browder. Circuit Court is in session and the trial will begin today.

It will be recalled that Browder is the negro who killed James Cunningham here last summer, which killing threw the country into a fever of excitement and was indirectly the cause of the lynching of four negroes at midnight.
