

### TAUGHT TOLSTOI KINDNESS

Serf Gave the Famous Russian, Then a Child, a Lesson Which He Never Forgot.

Objection to violence and cruelty, which was so characteristic of Tolstoi, began, according to Aylmer Maude's "Life," in early childhood. In a short story he wrote for the use of school children he tells how he once used to ride the old horse, Raven, after his brothers had each had a turn on it; and how, since Raven was too tired to move from the stable, he beat it till he broke his switch on its sides. He then demanded a stouter switch from the serf in charge, but the man replied: "Ah, master, you have no pity! Why do you beat him? He is twenty years old and is tired out; he can hardly breathe. Why, for a horse, he is as old as Timofeyitch"—a very old peasant living on the place. "You might as well get on Timofeyitch's back and drive him beyond his strength like that, with a switch. Would you feel no pity for him?"

I thought of Timofeyitch and harkened to the man. I got off the horse's back and when I noticed how its streaming sides were working and how heavily it breathed through its nostrils, swishing its thin tail, I understood how hard it was for it. Till then I had thought it was as happy as I was myself. And I felt so sorry for Raven that I began to kiss his sweaty neck and to beg his pardon for having beaten him.

Since then I have grown up, but I always remember Raven and Timofeyitch when I see horses ill treated.

### TRAVELING MASONIC BIBLE.

In the fall of 1909 Masons of Chicago started a Bible on a long journey. It is to be kept for a time in the possession of at least one lodge in every principal city of the country and ultimately returned to its starting point to be placed among the precious archives of the Chicago Masons.

It is expected that 25 years will be required for the Bible to complete its passage from lodge to lodge until all the blank pages provided for the record of its custodians shall have been filled. A lodge in Columbus, Ohio, which had retained the Bible since November, recently sent a special train to Springfield in that state to convey the traveling Bible to a lodge there, where it was received with impressive ceremonies. Before reaching Columbus it had been in the possession of lodges in Cincinnati and Dayton.

### "GEORGE SAND."

It was from Leonard Jules Sandeau, the celebrated French novelist and dramatist, born in Aubusson a century ago, that another and far greater writer derived her nom de guerre.

When a young student in Paris Sandeau made the acquaintance of Mme. Dudevant, and during a short lived friendship they collaborated in a novel, "Rose et Blanche," which was published in 1831. Then they parted, but Mme. Dudevant, while relinquishing Sandeau's friendship, took to herself a portion of his name and elected to be known thenceforth as George Sand.
