SOLD LOW**

Brought Only \$73,335 Less Than Half the Bonded Debt.

W. T. TANDY THE BIDDER

The Larger Bondholders it is Understood, Were the Purchasers.

The valuable Acme Mills & Elevator plant, idle for many months, was sold by the Commissioner yesterday and knocked down to W. T. Tandy, for the holders of the \$190,000 bonds for \$73,335; wagons and fixtures brought \$365 more. The confirmation of the sale will be passed upon by Judge Hanbery one day this week. The plant is a valuable one worth \$200,000 or more and a new company may be organized to operate the mills.
