BALTIMORE ON JUNE 25

Democrats Will Hold Their National Convention This Year.

DELEGATES AS PREFERRED.

Republican Convention To Be Held in Chicago a Week Earlier.

Washington, Jan. 10.—The democratic national committee completed its work here with the selection of Baltimore as the convention city. June 25 was fixed as the date of the national gathering when candidates for President and Vice-President will be selected. The Republican national convention is to be held in Chicago June 18.

The Democrats adopted a "permissive" primary resolution in connection with the call for delegates and such states as have laws on the subject, or desire to do so, can select their representatives in the national convention by direct vote. There are 1,074 delegates to be chosen.

National Chairman Norman E. Mack was named to head the subcommittee on arrangements for the convention. Vice-Chairman Hall, of Nebraska, and Secretary Urey Woodson, of Kentucky, will be ex-officio members of this subcommittee and there will be seven additional members to be named later by Mr. Mack.

After the seating of Guffey of Pa. and Mountcastle, of Tenn., there was entire harmony in the committee.

DOINGS AT FRANKFORT

Ollie James Is Formally Elected As United States Senator.

BILLS ARE BEING STARTED

Frankfort, Ky., Jan. 10.—Congressman Ollie James, nominated for Senator in the primary, was elected in joint session today, after having been voted for in the two houses separately yesterday. He received all of the Democratic votes.

Following is the committee on rules appointed by the speaker: Wallace Brown, H. H. Shoberth, M. F. Pogue, Ben E. Niles, Elwood Hamilton, L. C. Owings, B. S. Wilson, E. B. Thompson, E. L. Young and W. V. Parry.

The first bill introduced this session was by Senator Eaton, in the senate. It was the compulsory primary law, requiring both leading political parties to nominate their candidates on the same day and at public expense.

Seventh Street is a very narrow street and is the only connection at present with the West Side which has 1500 population, and thousands of people have to enter the city by that route. Every effort will be made to make the street one of the most orderly in the city. All temporary permits will be revoked on Feb. 1st, 30 days being allowed to secure other locations.

PEMBROKE

Cuts Expenses And Trustees Serve For Nothing.

The new year meeting of the board of town trustees was held at the city hall Monday night, Mayor Jones and all the members being present, says the Pembroke Journal.

As the long looked for drouth sets in in Pembroke in the early spring, considerable interest attached to the meeting, as plans for increasing the revenue of the town, to make up for the loss of the saloon license were to be made. After considerable discussion, in which various plans were discussed, the board adopted an ordinance continuing the same license schedule that has been in force for several years, except that a license of \$150 was imposed upon soft drink stands and \$10 on soda fountains. In many towns that have gone dry the soft drink stands are alleged to have opened as a blind behind which "hard" drinks are served. Hence the heavy license fixed in advance.

The board started an economy crusade by voting to serve the town for the next two years without compensation. The salary of the clerk was reduced from \$50 to \$30 and that of that of the treasurer from \$30 to \$20. The salary of policeman was fixed at \$50, which has been paid for several years past.
