Need of a Tariff Commission. While the general verdict seems to be that the Democrats have done very well under existing conditions, it would be quite preposterous to conclude that they have given us a final or an ideal piece of revenue legislation. They have merely brought us to a basis from which we ought to proceed with great deliberation to work out a fairly intelligent and scientific plan of national taxation.

Although the new measure carries no provision for a tariff commission, there were test votes which showed that it would not be difficult to pass such a project through the Senate. A tariff commission ought to be created at the earliest possible moment to assist Congress in its future work. Many questions of detail will come up again in the light of early experience.—From "The Progress of the World," in the American Review of Reviews for October.
