Princeton Presbytery.
Princeton Presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian church, met with the Piney Fork congregation October 5 1909.

The opening sermon was preached by Rev. Hugh Watson of the Chattanooga Presbytery, he taking for his text the first eight verses of the 30th chapter of St. John.

Ten ministers answered the roll call. Only two were absent. These are very old men and have leave of absence at will. Twenty seven congregations were represented.

Rev. J. T. Barbee, Moderator of the General Assembly, was with us, and was called to the rostrum. He responded with "Echoes" from Bentonville Assembly, which was of much interest to the presbytery.

Rev. John King, of Blackford, was elected moderator.

Our commissioners to the Bentonville Assembly had pledged \$100.00 for Princeton Presbytery to our Legal Fund.

On Wednesday morning the Presbytery called for contributions for the purpose of paying the amount pledged and \$164.50 was raised. Sharon congregation had already sent in \$75.

At 11 o'clock Wednesday, the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was observed. Rev. G. L. Woodruff preached from Revelation 21: 5. Rev. Milton L. Clemons administered the Sacrament.

Wednesday evening was spent in discussing a Christian Endeavor and Sunday school programme.

Wednesday evening the ladies conducted a song and prayer service. Mrs. Edna Perry, Presbyterial President, conducted the service.

Mrs. N. H. Feostress, Presbyterial secretary of the Ladies' Missionary Society, made a report of last year's

work. Songs and recitation by the children from Hupkiss and "Echoes" from Bentonville convention, by Miss Belle Ellis, completed a very interesting program. A collection was taken for Missions, amounting to \$12.45.

Thursday morning was taken up with the reports of committees. At 11 o'clock Rev. A. C. Bidde preached a strong sermon from Zacariah 1:14. Everybody was delighted.

Presbytery closed with a good old-time handshake. Piney Fork church and their friends who helped to entertain the Presbytery deserved much credit for their hospitality.
