Bro. Smart undertakes to teach
 that apostasy is the one doctrine
 taught in the Bible. There are, it

 37,000 women who are supporting

 wants and necessities of these three
 classes, it would fail to meet the
 wants of the church. It must have
 encouragements, admonitions and
 threatenings, else the christian could
 not be developed, the self-deceived
 could not be awakened, nor the
 hypocrite aroused. These warnings,
 etc., must be general, so as to give
 each class needful help. In Ken-
 tucky we have citizens of different
 kinds, just as we have in the church.

We have members of different
 classes but the enactments of our
 civil code are general. Must be so.
 The warnings and threatenings
 are addressed to all citizens alike,
 telling the penalties for theft, for
 house burning, etc. They say to
 the honest man, if you steal you will
 be punished; and to the upright
 citizen, if you burn your neighbor's

 answer of these men? Certainly
 they they would admit that the laws
 are just and good. But can we say
