### Prizes For Essays, 1913

The Kentucky Educational Association will hold its annual session in Louisville on April 30, May 1, 3 and 4, 1913. Special attention will be given to the qualifications, powers and duties of subdistrict trustees and the officers of the Association have arranged for a special round table for the discussion of the problems of the trustee.

In order to encourage a large attendance of trustees at this meeting, Mr. John B. McFerran of Louisville has offered the following prizes:

1. A prize of \$50.00 in gold to the county having the largest attendance of trustees and members of city and graded school Boards of Education.
2. A prize of \$25.00 in gold for the best essay written by a sub-district trustee on the subject, "Duties of a Subdistrict Trustee."
3. A prize of \$25.00 in gold for the best essay written by the county Superintendent or teacher on the subject "Duties of a Sub-district Trustee."

4. A prize of \$25.00 in gold for the best essay written by anyone on the subject, "Qualifications of a Subdistrict Trustee and How to get him"

The following rules will govern in awarding the prizes on essays: All essays are limited to 500 words or less. The board of directors, composed of Superintendent Barksdale Hamlette, Frankfort; President R. L. McFarland, Owensboro; President H. H. Cherry, Bowling Green; Superintendent E. F. Darnaby, Winchester, and Superintendent Jay O'Daniels, Louisa, will act as Judges and award the prizes. All essays must be complete and in the hands of the Secretary not later than noon Wednesday, April 23, 1913. The winners of the prizes will be announced on the first day of the meeting and the winners will be required to read their essay in person of the meeting.
