A PROLIFIC SOW.

A large Yorkshire sow is reported by a correspondent of an English exchange to have farrowed 85 pigs in five litters and reared 66. Three times she reared 15, although she gave milk on only nine teats. Her largest litter was 21. No pigs were destroyed. Also the same breeder had two sows that farrowed 13 each. One sow died almost immediately, and the other reared the 26. They were kept in two separate lots, and the sow driven from one to the other every three or four hours. A much bigger litter can be reared in this way, if the sow is a good milker, and the little ones sooner learn to drink.
