Lowest Railroad Rates.

The railroads in Kentucky have made a rate of one fare plus twenty-five cents for the round trip to Louisville on account of the Kentucky State Fair, September 16th to 21st. Tickets will go on sale Saturday, September 14th, and will be good returning until Monday following the fair, September 23d. The rate in Indiana will not be one fare on account of the regular rate being two cents a mile instead of three as it is in Kentucky; however, low rates will apply from points in Indiana.


