NOVEL READING.

A Suggestion For Less of It For Girls Under Twenty-five.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS.

The best filler to use with linoleum is sawdust, sifted evenly over the floor. Stains from matches on walls or marble may be removed by applying whiting, pumice stone and water. Hearstons painted with two or three coats of white enamel are easily cleaned by wiping with a damp cloth. If films are added to the paste used in covering boxes with paper or for scrap-books, moths or mice will not invade them. It is much better to have plastered walls painted than papered. Paint can be washed occasionally and is really more economical than paper. A painter suggests that if the bathtub be given two coats of common paint before the enamel paint is applied, letting each dry for twenty-four hours, the objectionable flaking off process will not follow.

THE DOUBLE CHIN.

Correct Treatment to Rid Oneself of This Heinous.

There is scarcely any one who retains the contour of the lower part of the face after the age of thirty. Either the underjaw becomes thin or the dreaded double chin arrives, and both could be prevented if a few precautions were taken against the tendency of nature to play tricks with this part. The correct treatment for the lower part of the face is to rest the face in the palms of both hands, with the fingers resting on the temples. The thumbs will then be along the jawbone and the cheek will rest against the full flat of the hand. In this position knead the face gently, always bearing in mind the lifting process of the flesh on the face. The same treatment applies for the double chin and the emaciated face. As many people will doubt this statement, it is best explained that either condition has been brought about by sluggish circulation, and this results sometimes in an insufficient and sometimes in a superfluous deposit of fatty tissue. Therefore massage, which equalizes matters, repairs the wrong in both cases. It builds up wasted tissues and causes to be absorbed any unhealthy deposit of fat.

HAY DOORS.

Ways of Hanging Gable Doors For the Hayrack.

There are several ways of hanging gable doors for the hayrack, and among a number illustrated and described by Country Gentleman are the following:

Where the hay is removed from the load with slings the door must have a width nearly equal to that of the load itself, and in the diagrams the door is represented as eleven feet wide by seven feet high. To make perfectly sure that the loaded fork or sling clears with the easiest the door is safer made 12 by 12 feet where the dimensions of the barn will permit of it.


In Fig. 1 is represented the gable door hinged at the bottom, so as to open outward and downward. In this




type of door it is necessary for closing the door to provide a rope passing over a pulley in the gable. In order to make the door as small and light as possible a window, which may be closed if desired with a pair of small doors opening in, for the outdoor extension of the carrier support and track, is provided. This arrangement allows a shorter door to be used than would otherwise be necessary.

Another type of door is hung in the manner of a window sash, balanced by weights, so that it falls and rises in a midway built to the end of the barn outside.

The type of door shown in Fig. 2 is made in two sections, rolling in opposite directions on a foot track secured to the outside of the barn. In order to provide sufficient slideway for the doors a slot is left in the end projection of the roof, and the dotted lines show where the doors stand when open wide. These doors might also be made to roll aside, hung from an overhead track. It is further possible to make this type of door in narrower sections, so that one section rolls past the other, thus necessitating less length of slideway. Such a modification would be desirable only where the width of the gable was sufficient to make slots in the roof unnecessary.



Where the barn has a hip roof and its width is thirty-eight or more feet the doors may be made to roll aside on an overhead track, as represented in Fig. 2, where the door is made in two sections. These doors could also be hung on side hinges and made to swing out. So, too, could they be made to roll aside on the inside of the barn if this were thought to be more desirable. Where the barn has a width of thirty-six feet or less the doors may be made to fold in two or more folds, and the folding may be accomplished by means of hinges or the sections may be mounted to roll past one another on either overhead or on foot tracks.

Moisture Requirements.

It is stated by the state experiment station that when the straw necessary to produce a bushel of wheat is estimated at ninety pounds the water required in Colorado to produce a bushel of grain amounts to 58.25 tons. More moisture is required to mature crops under semi-arid than under humid conditions. Ranking from lowest to highest in the amount of water required for maturity, the common field crops are given in the following order: Corn, potatoes, wheat, barley, field peas, oats, alfalfa and red clover.

Mutton Ragout.


Cut the mutton into two inch lengths (three cupfuls in all), season with salt and pepper and dust with flour. Place in a hot oven and brown the meat, shaking often. Drain the pan to the back of the range, lift the meat out with a skimmer and place it on the serving dish. Add a pint of oysters (chopped) to the gravy, also an onion and a sprig of parsley (minced). Cook for five minutes and add a cupful of milk. When hot add two tablespoonfuls of flour stirred to a paste with a little cold water. When these are well cooked taste the gravy and add more seasoning if necessary; then pour it over the mutton and serve at once. The oysters should be drained well before adding to the gravy.

FARM MECHANICS.

An Arrangement For Transferring Power From a Wind Wheel.

Sometimes it is desirable to place the wind wheel upon some building instead of erecting a frame directly over the pump. In this case the power may be transferred by a system of iron elbow joints, as in Fig. 1. The arms show plainly that a downward stroke by the wheel produces an equal downward stroke at the pump. The angle



of the iron joints should be such that their arms will be at right angles to the corresponding wooden arms in the middle of the stroke.

The arm, A B, may be made of any desirable length. The original of the drawing is over twenty-five feet. When of such length, however, it is best to stiffen it with several hinged braces from the side of the building, as in Fig. 2. These allow perfect freedom of motion and are used merely to prevent sidewise bending.—American Agriculturist.

The House Cleaning Habit.
